Mental Health, Resilience, and Trauma in Post-Conflict Communities (1)



• Students will travel to both Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. The course explores themes of resilience, mental health, and trauma in post-conflict societies.



 The travel experience examines the ongoing recovery of Ireland/Northern Ireland from the thirty-year cycle of political and sectarian violence labelled as 'The Troubles' which ended in 1998.

Mental Health, Resilience, and Trauma in Post-Conflict Communities (2)



 The immersive experience will involve interdisciplinary discussions about reconciliation and restorative justice with academic partners at Ulster University.



 The main project for the course challenges students to consider truth and reconciliation and intergenerational traumas within the context of Northern Ireland & Ireland and in relation to the Calls to Action in Canada.

 - 1. What draws you to this specific global learning opportunity? Briefly explain how it connects to your academic interests (across any discipline), intellectual curiosities, or career plans.
 - 2. What do you hope to gain from this opportunity? Name one or two specific things you want out of this experience (e.g., a skill to practice or an issue to explore) and how this tour will help you do that.
 - 3. What challenges do you expect while on the tour (culture, language, personal)? Tell us about a time you adapted to something new and how that experience will guide you on this trip.
 - 4. What strengths will you bring to the group? Share any relevant experience or preparation (academic, personal, or interpersonal) and how it will help you contribute to a supportive, academically engaged cohort.


