What courses do I need to complete in order to graduate?

This program plan is designed under the assumption that a student has been admitted into this program with **10.0 transfer credits from their ECE diploma** and would be expected to complete the following 10.0 credits:

- 8.0 credits – ECS Core Courses
- 1.5 credits – ECS Restricted Electives
- 0.5 credit – General Elective

Students who received **more than 10.0 credits** will need to review their Transfer Credit Assessment to determine their remaining requirements in this program.

- It is important to keep in mind that some Bachelor of Education and other postgraduate programs may require the completion of at least 10.0 undergraduate degree-level credits (not including college diploma transfer credits) for the purpose of admission. If you have been admitted into this program with more than 10.0 credits, you may be required to complete additional courses to satisfy admissions requirements for some postgraduate programs.

How do I complete one of the specialization options? Is it required?

Students are not required to complete a specialization. To complete a specialization, three specific restricted elective courses need to be taken in a particular area: **Children's Futures (CF)**, **Infant & Child Mental Health (MH)**, **Pathway to Child Life (CL)** as outlined on the last page.

- Students pursuing a specialization in one of these areas must complete and submit an [Area of Emphasis Declaration Form](#) online. Specialization course options are scheduled by semester in the Program Plan below. Students may declare one specialization.

If students do not want to complete a specialization, the three ECS restricted elective courses can be taken across different specializations.

Am I required to complete a field practicum?

No. ECS transfer students are granted transfer credit for all field placement courses in the program.
