What courses do I need to complete in order to graduate?

Students typically receive 10.0 transfer credits when entering the ECS program as an ECE transfer student. The remaining 10.0 credits of the degree are outlined on the second page of this document. Student must complete **8.0 core credits**, **1.5 ECS restricted elective** and **0.5 general elective credit** to be eligible to graduate.

If you have received **more than 10.0 credits**, you are encouraged to consult with your Academic Advisor regarding your remaining requirements in this program. Please refer to your **Transfer Credit Assessment** to confirm the credits from which you are exempt.

It is important to keep in mind that some Bachelor of Education and other postgraduate programs may require the completion of at least 10.0 undergraduate degree-level credits (not including college diploma transfer credits) for the purpose of admission. If you have been admitted into this program with more than 10.0 credits, you may be required to complete additional courses to satisfy admissions requirements for some postgraduate programs.

How do I complete one of the specialization options? Is it required?

Students can choose to complete one of **three optional specializations**. Completing a specialization is **not required**. The specialization is earned upon completion of all courses in the program. To complete a specialization, three restricted elective courses need to be taken in a particular area:

Children's Futures (CF)	Infant & Child Mental Health (MH)	Pathway to Child Life (CL)

If students do not want to complete a specialization, the three courses can be taken across different specializations. Students pursuing a specialization in one of these areas must complete and submit an **Area of Emphasis Declaration Form** online. Specialization course options are scheduled by semester in the Program Plan below.

Am I required to complete a field practicum?

No. ECS transfer students are **granted transfer credit** for all field placement courses in the program.

Can I complete a practicum if I would like to?

Yes. You can request to complete a practicum course during your time at Guelph-Humber. Speak to the **ECS Field Placement Coordinator** about this possibility.
