What courses do I need to complete in order to graduate?

You must complete 20 credits (40 courses), including the following:

- 17.0 credits – 32 Core Courses
- 1.5 credits – 3 General Electives
- 1.5 credits – 3 Restricted Electives

How do I complete one of the specialization options? Is it required?

Students can choose to complete one of three optional specializations. Completing a specialization is not required. The specialization is earned upon completion of all courses in the program. To complete a specialization, three restricted elective courses need to be taken in a particular area: **Children's Futures (CF)**, **Infant & Child Mental Health (MH)**, **Pathway to Child Life (CL)**. If students do not want to complete a specialization, the three courses can be taken across different areas of emphasis. Students pursuing a specialization in one of these areas must complete and submit an Area of Emphasis Declaration Form online. Specialization course options are scheduled by semester in the Program Plan below.



Is there a Field Placement in the ECS Program?

Yes. starting in second year, winter semester, students receive workplace experience through **five progressive practicum placements** in early childhood and educational settings across the GTA. Students will be considered 'professionals in training' and performance expectations will increase according to the semester level. Throughout the placements, students participate in classroom seminars to critically analyze and share their experiences.

I am a Transfer Student. How do I know which courses I can select?

Transfer students earning 10.0+ block transfer credits from a high affinity Early Childhood Studies diploma should not use this Program Plan. Instead, refer to the Transfer Program Plan on our website according to course delivery format (e.g. part-time, full-time, online, etc). If less than 10.0 transfer credits were earned, courses noted on the Official Transfer Credit Assessment can be crossed off from this document below. Transfer students should connect with their Academic Advisor to confirm their course sequencing in advance of course selection.
