What courses do I need to complete in order to graduate?



Students typically receive 10.0 transfer credits when entering the Justice program as a Justice transfer student from the applicable diploma/s. The remaining 10.0 credits of the degree are outlined on the second page of this document. Student must complete 6.0 core credits. 3.0 specialization credits – Community and Justice Services (CJS) or Police Foundations (POL) and 1.0 restricted elective credits.

***If you opt for the Police Foundations specialization, you must also complete 2 non-credit physical fitness practicums.**

Students are required to choose their specialization in the first semester of studies. Each course in the Justice Studies program has a credit value of 0.5, unless otherwise noted. Each course in the Justice Studies program has a credit value of 0.5, unless otherwise noted.

If you have received **more or less than 10.0 credits**, you are encouraged to consult with your Academic Advisor. Refer to your Transfer Credit Assessment to confirm the credits from which you are exempt.

Am I required to complete a field placement?

Yes. Students will complete **one community service placement (JUST*3050)** in your final semester for a total **100 hours**. Justice Studies students will develop sensitivity to contemporary social issues ranging from abuse and violence to welfare. Throughout their placements, students participate in weekly seminars to critically analyze their volunteer experiences.
