What courses do I need to complete in order to graduate?

You must complete 20 credits (40 courses), including the following:

- 14.0 credits – 28 Core Courses
- 1.0 credits – 2 Restricted Justice Studies Electives
- 2.0 credits – 4 General Electives (non justice courses)
- 3 Non-Credit Practicum Courses for Policing & Community Safety Students only



Students are required to choose their specialization after their first year of studies. Each course in the Justice Studies program has a credit value of 0.5, unless otherwise noted.

Is there Workplace Experience integrated in the Justice Studies Program?

Yes. Students will complete community service placements in second and third year. Both placements total 200 hours (100 hours each placement). Justice Studies students will develop sensitivity to contemporary social issues ranging from abuse and violence to welfare. Throughout their placements, students participate in weekly seminars to critically analyze their volunteer experiences.
