What courses do I need to complete in order to graduate?

You must complete 20 credits (40 courses), including the following:

- 16.5 credits – 33 Core Courses
- 2.0 credits – 4 SSWS Restricted Elective Courses
- 1.5 credits – 3 General Electives



I am a Transfer Student. How do I know which courses I can select?

Transfer Students should use this document, in conjunction with their official credit assessment to determine which courses they have been granted, and which courses they need to take. Transfer students should meet with their Academic Advisor to confirm the schedule they have developed in advance of the course selection dates.

Are there Field Placements in the SSWS Program?

Yes. Starting in second year, students receive workplace experience through three progressive practicum placements in community agencies across the GTA. Students will be considered “professionals in training” and performance expectations will increase according to the semester level. Throughout the placements students participate in classroom seminars to critically analyze and share their experiences.

Am I required to complete a Specialization?

Completing a Specialization is optional. To complete a specialization, students are required to complete at least 1.5 restricted electives within a specific area, Mental Health Practice (MHP) or Youth and Families (YF). Students will be required to submit a Declaration of Area of Emphasis form online no later than the 7th semester of study.

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Specialization Checklist and Restricted SSWS Electives

Students may choose between two optional specializations. To obtain recognition for a specialization, students are required to complete **a minimum of 1.5 restricted electives credits (3 courses)** from the listing in that specific area. Only one specialization may be declared.

If opting to complete a specialization, students must declare a specialization by the start of their seventh (7th) semester of full-time study. Only one specialization may be declared. Transfer students admitted under an articulation agreement (block credit) are not eligible for a specialization.
