





We welcome applicants from secondary schools around the world. To be considered for admission, you must fulfil the following three criteria:

International Credentials

American Curriculum

You will be considered based on an unweighted cumulative GPA from a regionally accredited high school.

- A minimum 2.7 unweighted cumulative GPA and meet the subject requirements
- Advanced Placement (AP) courses will be considered and exam results of 4 or higher may qualify for transfer credit
- SAT or ACT optional

British Patterned Education (GCE)

- Minimum of two Advanced Level passes and three GCSE or IGCSE (Ordinary Level) passes
- Two Advanced Subsidiary (AS) Level courses may be substituted for one Advanced Level course
- Minimum "B/C" or 6 grade on GCSE/IGCSE, AS and predicted Advanced Level examinations with a minimum of five unique subject areas

Caribbean

- Complete the Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examination (CAPE) Diploma with a minimum of 2 two-unit courses at the CAPE level
- CAPE courses must be completed with a minimum score of 3
- Other subjects must be presented at the CSEC (CXC) level

International Baccalaureate (IB)

- IB Diploma Program with three Higher Level (HL) and three Standard Level (SL) courses with a minimum overall score of 24. Reported bonus points will be taken into consideration.
- We will consider IB certificate program and career program students on a case-by-case basis
- Any Higher or Standard Level mathematics course is an acceptable prerequisite for programs that require math

Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE)

- Class 12 Boards Exam Certificate with predicted scores at a minimum of 70%
- Early admission decisions can be made based on verified 10th Standard Board results accompanied by predicted Class 12 grades listed by subject from the school
- If applying to Business or Kinesiology and you do not have 12th Standard Math, conditional offers can be made based on enrolment in one of the following Ontario math courses: MDM4U, MHF4U or MCV4U at ontariovirtualschool.ca

After applying, you will receive login information and instructions to upload documents to your Admission Portal. Submit the appropriate transcripts and other required documentation as listed in your portal checklist.

Submit English proficiency test scores as required. IELTS scores may be scanned and verified on site. All other test scores must be sent officially.

Monitor your email and Admission Portal for application updates and next steps.





Accept your Offer of Admission

Offers of Admission are made on a rolling basis. Your offer will include a scholarship offer, Visa information documents and the conditions of your admission, when applicable. You can accept your offer in your Admission Portal.

Study Permit processing timelines fluctuate. We encourage students to apply early to ensure they are ready to begin their studies.



Study & Co-op Permits

Most international students are required to have a valid Study Permit while studying in Canada. Most students will need a Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL), unless exempt, to apply for a Study Permit. The University of Guelph-Humber issues Provincial Attestation Letters (PAL) under the following DLI number: O19305391192. Your PAL will be available to you after accepting your Offer of Admission, paying your admission deposit and uploading the required documents. You may begin your Study Permit application process once you have received your PAL.

To complete your workplace experience, you will be required to obtain a Co-op Work Permit. We encourage you to apply for study and co-op permits at the same time.


After graduation

All programs begin in September, with the exception of Business Administration, which has a January (Jan) and a September (Sept) entry.








