
# International Entrance Scholarships



We're invested in you. Financial assistance for our international students is available in support of your studies. All applicants will be automatically considered for entrance scholarships.

## International Student Entrance Scholarship (Renewable)

**Up to \$20,500 over 4 years**



### Renewal (Years 2, 3 & 4)

- Receive an award of **\$4,000 CAD** when your previous year's average (before year of renewal) is 80% or above and you have a full-time course load
- Eligible for renewal for three years after admission
- Automatically considered for each renewal year

## International Academic Achievement Entrance Scholarship

**\$2,000 CAD per recipient**

- Successful completion of the IB diploma program (minimum 30 points in diploma required), or
- Successful completion of the GCSE with a minimum of 2 A-levels (minimum final year B average required)

## University of Guelph-Humber Study in Canada Scholarship

**\$1,000 CAD per recipient**

- Minimum 75% admission average for consideration

# Study & Co-op Permits

The Canadian government requires all international students to have an approved Study Permit. The University of Guelph-Humber issues Provincial Attestation Letters (PAL) under the following DLI number: O19305391192. Once you have accepted your offer and received all your required documentation, you may begin your study permit application process.

To complete your workplace experience, you will be required to obtain a Co-op Work Permit. We encourage you to apply for study and co-op permits at the same time.

## Post-graduation Work Permit

International students who graduate from U of GH are eligible to apply for a Post-graduation Work Permit. 
