Participant Code for International Field Trips

An international field trip is a unique academic opportunity in which the environment becomes the classroom and learning is not confined to reading texts or attending lectures.

All participants of a University of Guelph-Humber international field trip must be a minimum of eighteen years of age at the time of departure. As such, all are legally adults and will be expected to conduct themselves accordingly.

When abroad, any conduct which contravenes the laws of the host country, puts in jeopardy the safety of any participant of the course, seriously disrupts the delivery of the course, violates the rules and regulations established in good faith by the accompanying University of Guelph-Humber faculty member, or detracts in a substantial way from the learning environment, will not be tolerated.

Students participating in University of Guelph-Humber sponsored international field trips are expected to conform to the same standards of behaviour as published in the Humber/Guelph-Humber Charter of Student Responsibilities and Rights, which can be found by visiting: http://www.humber.ca/charter/. Any violation of the student code of conduct may result in disciplinary action or sanctions by the University of Guelph-Humber.

Refund Policy

Note that the refund policy applies equally to:

- (a) Students who gain acceptance into the course and decide not to participate in mandatory pre-departure orientation and/or the international field trip
- (b) Students who withdraw voluntarily or by administrative withdrawal

Note: The pre-departure orientation meeting is mandatory. Students who do not participate in the orientation will not be allowed to participate in the international field trip and will be refunded only that amount of money that can be feasibly returned to University of Guelph-Humber from hotels, travel agents or for tickets, accommodation, less the \$500 non-refundable deposit.

Course applications must be accompanied by a \$500 deposit.

- If an applicant is not accepted into the course, the deposit will be returned in its entirety. Otherwise, the deposit is not refundable.
- Payments (over and above the deposit) that can feasibly be refunded to the University of Guelph-Humber will be returned upon withdrawal for valid reasons. Extenuating circumstances that would allow for a refund would include proof of a personal, family or medical emergency submitted with a written request for a refund. These reasons do not include an inability to raise sufficient funds for participation, early return due to culture shock, homesickness, legal or academic discipline, criminal activity, or external events in the outside community that are beyond the control of the University of Guelph-Humber.

In the event that I should decide to cancel my participation or am forced to withdraw from the course for any reason, I am still responsible for all course costs incurred on my behalf prior to such cancellation or withdraw.
