Finding Full Text Online




Finding full text for an article from a citation is not difficult. This guide shows you how to locate full text using the eJournals menu.


1. On the <u>UofGH Library homepage</u> select the eJournals tab. Choose the library collection you wish to search. Start with Guelph's collection, since it is larger than Humber's.



2. Enter the journal title in the title search box and click **Search**. Make sure you're entering the **journal title**, not the **article title**. **Hint**: in APA references, Journal Title is in italics.



3. Note that different databases provide full text for different date ranges. Choose the database that includes the publication date for your article.




4. In the database, locate the list of volumes and issues. Navigate to the issue that contains your article.



Hint: Look for links labeled All Issues or Archive.

5. Locate the article inside the issue. Click to access a PDF or HTML full text version of the article.
