

## Frequently Asked Questions

### What courses do I need to complete in order to graduate?

Students must complete 20.0 credits including 17.5 core credits (including 1.5 certificate credits) as specified in the Academic Calendar, and 2.5 general elective credits.

### What is the Thesis Stream option?

Students can choose to complete a Thesis. This is a good option for students who wish to apply to graduate programs or wish to gain experience conducting research. In Semester 5, students would take a second statistics course (*PSYC\*3120 Quantification in Psychology II*) in preparation for the *PSYC\*4210 Thesis I* and *PSYC\*4220 Thesis II*. If students opt to not take this stream, they would complete an *Honours Seminar in Psychology* instead (*PSYC\*4200*). Students wishing to take Thesis I must meet the following prerequisites: 80% cumulative average, *PSYC\*3120* (75% min), *AHSS\*1110*, *AHSS\*1120*, *PSYC\*3130*. Program Head Consent is also required. Students are to submit an Undergraduate Course Request Form to their Advisor to request permission to take the Thesis course ([www.guelphhumber.ca/advising/forms](http://www.guelphhumber.ca/advising/forms))

### What electives should I take?

Choose electives from the published [Electives Course Schedule](#) that interest you.

### Am I required to take my electives at the University of Guelph-Humber?

Letters of Permission may be available for you to take electives at another university. Please contact your Academic Advisor.

### How do I complete one of the certificate options? Is it required?

Students can choose to complete one of three optional certificates. Completing a certificate is not required, but you must take one certificate course from each grouping, as outlined in the plan on the next pages. The certificate credential is earned upon completion of all course work in the program. In order to complete one of the certificates, three courses need to be taken in a particular area:

If students do not want to earn a certificate, the three courses can be taken across different areas of emphasis – IR, OB, or RS. Students pursuing a certificate in one of these areas must complete and submit a [Declaration of Area of Emphasis Form](#) online. Certificate course options are scheduled by semester in the Program Plan below.

### Can I receive more than one certificate?

No. Students can earn up to one certificate.

### I am a transfer student. How do I know which courses to select?

Transfer students should use this document in conjunction with their *Official Transfer Credit Assessment* to determine which courses they have been granted, and which courses they need to take. Transfer students should meet with their Academic Advisor to discuss the schedule they have developed in advance of the course selection dates.
